Described by Kate Ceberano as "an asset to the cabaret community", Michaela Burger is the recipient of the award for Best Cabaret Adelaide Fringe 2016 and has been nominated for a Helpmann Academy for Best Cabaret Performer 2016.

Studying at the Adelaide Conservatorium of Music, Burger went on to obtain a masters in Musical Theatre at Mountview Academy of Performing Arts, London, and performed in many well-known venues including Too2Much in Soho and Cabaret Confidential in Covent Garden.

In addition to winning the 2015 International Cabaret Contest, Burger is the co-writer and star of the successful stage show Exposing Edith, about the life and songs of Edith Piaf.
